### Year 3 and free school meals

## Uniform

Earlier this week, we sent out a form on Parent Mail regarding free school uniform. Woodlands Academy are providing every child from, Reception to Year 6, with one set of school uniform, completely free of charge. This uniform includes on pair of trousers/one skirt, one jumper/one cardigan and a polo shirt. The form asks for parents to indicate which sizes they would like for their child and, which items they need out of the jumper/cardigan and trousers/skirt. Please ensure you have completed this form by 10am, Monday 12th September.

Some parents have said they don't want or need the uniform. I would encourage all parents to order uniform and donate it back to school.

This year we will be holding a uniform swap shop each month. Parents/Carers will be able to swap uniform or purchase second hand uniform for a small charge of 50p per item. More information will follow later this term.

#### Attendance

Well done to all the children who have made a good kick start to the new school year by making it in on time every day!

We'd like to make you aware that the Government's focus for schools this year is attendance. The pandemic has had such a massive effect on children across the country, and them being in school consistently is what is needed to help continue to bring them back to where they need to be.

Our whole-school attendance target is 97%. At the end of term 6, our whole-school attendance was 90.2%. We know we can improve on this figure this year, as long parents continue to work with us as best they can.

Please remember that if children are late and arrive after 9.20am, this goes down as an unauthorised absence for their morning registration. If children (over the age of 5) have 8 unauthorised absences (each day equates to two sessions meaning 8 sessions is 4 days) within a 10-week period, parents will be referred to receive a penalty notice. The penalty notice is £60, per parent, per child which rises to £120 if you don't pay within 21 days. If you don't pay the fine after 28 days, you may be prosecuted (under Section 444 of the Education Act) for the offence of failing to ensure your child's regular attendance at school.

As always, if you do ever feel as though you're struggling a little and you need some help, Mrs Sheldon is around to offer a helping hand.
