Money & ParentPay



We are now a cashless school. All payments to school must be done via ParentPay. The only exception to this is for any external clubs that are being run. You can set up a ParentPay account and pay directly through this or alternatively pay via PayPoint. You will need to request a bar code from school in order to pay this way.

Care Plans & Medicines

As it is a new school year we need to update care plans. If your child needs to have medicine regularly administered in school or is allergic to anything they must have a care plan. Evidence of any allergies must be supported by medical evidence.

To administer any medicine in school, including inhalers, we must have a detailed and signed form. Please arrange with the office to come in and update any care plans or set up new one.

Uniform & Water Bottles

It is lovely to see all of the children coming back in uniform. Please make sure all items of clothing are labelled with your child's name.

Children need to have PE kits in school from Year 1 upwards. Reception children will need to bring in a PE kit from Term 2 onwards.

Children may bring in a water bottle from home to drink from while they are working. This must have their child's name on and be filled with water or very weak sugar free squash.

Our whole school target this year is **97%.** Attendance will continue to be a focus for our school this year. Our attendance is below what is expected of us by the government and poor attendance also has a detrimental effect on your child's learning.

Please make sure your child is in school and on time. Any child coming into school after 9am is given a late mark and after 9.20am is given an unauthorised absence. The school gates open at 8.40am for the children to enter school.

If you need to request time off school you must fill in a Leave of Absence Request form. These are available from the office.



re you entitled? Free School Meal & Pupil Premium

If you think you may be entitled to free school meals you can apply on the Bristol City Council's website. <u>https://efsm.bristol.gov.uk</u>

If you are eligible for free school meals you will receive them until March 2022.

The school gets additional pupil premium funding for pupils who currently are entitled to free school meals or have been in the last 6 years. If you need any help applying please contact the office.

Behaviour Expectations

At Woodlands we have a set of behaviour expectations that all children are aware of. This is the same as last year but now displayed in a different format. When children do not follow these expectations repeatedly sanctions are put in place and this is recorded by the teacher. This is what is meant by 'receiving a number'. We also have a variety of positive behaviour rewards such as golden tickets, stickers, prizes and certificates. We will be working with Y6 ambassadors to look at further improving positive rewards this year.



Clubs

A list of free clubs will be going home next week for children to sign up to until the end of Term 2. Please complete the form and send it back into school. You will have a text message to say if your child has been successful in obtaining a place at a club. If any club is oversubscribed we will have a waiting list in case a space becomes available.

We also have Bristol Sport running paid clubs this year. The children should have received a letter about these this week. The cost of these are £14 for 7 sessions. The full cost must be paid in advance to secure a place.

Roads around the school

The roads around school can get very congested during drop off and pick up times. Please make sure you are parking safely and not obstructing resident's driveways.

We will be talking to the children about road safety but we also ask that you talk to them about how to cross the road safely and about stranger danger. There were a number of children who ran out in front of cars and nearly got hurt.
