

Open Day

Lateness

Lateness is still a problem at school. The equivalent of 8 ½ days of learning has been lost due to lateness this term alone. This is a huge figure and has a substantial impact on children's learning. The registers close at 9am. Children must be in class by this time. Any child who is not in their classroom by 9am will be marked as late.

Lateness also causes problems for the kitchen and the cooking of lunches. Lunches are cooked to order to reduce the amount of waste food. There is minimal extra food prepared. From next term any child arriving after 10am will have to bring a packed lunch with them.
