Reporting COVID-19 cases during the holidays

Where a pupil tests positive for Covid-19, having developed symptoms <u>more</u> than 48 hours since being in school, the school is not to be contacted and parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Where a pupil tests positive for Covid-19, having developed symptoms <u>within</u> 48 hours since being school, parents are to follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace, AND email <u>wood.covidpositive@woodlandsacademybristol.com</u>. <u>This email address is for</u> <u>positive Covid cases ONLY. and is not to be used for general queries. Please call NHS II9</u> <u>if you need any Covid related medical advice.</u> Also, this email account will <u>only</u> be monitored between the 19th and 24th December. Positive cases after this date do not need to be brought to the school's attention by parents.

What do I do if my child has COVID-19 symptoms?

Symptome of coronavirue in children

The main symptome of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

What to do if your child has symptoms

If your child has any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

- 1. Get a test to check if they have coronavirus as soon as possible.
- 2. Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get the test result only leave your home to have a test.

Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get the result. If your child has one of these symptoms, they need to self-isolate and will not be able to come into school for 10 days unless they have a negative test.




'My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively' $_{\rm 54\ responses}$




The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year. 54 responses




When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly. 54 responses




Does your child have special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) 54 responses















Covid-19 in Stockwood December 2020

Thank you everyone for all that you are doing to support the community through the pandemic this year. However, we have to be honest with you and say that, although infection rates are generally coming down across Bristol, they remain relatively high in Stockwood, especially among the under 40s. Remember that we can have Covid-19 without having any symptoms at all, especially if we are younger, and so pass it on to others without knowing it.

You know the standard rules are:



In particular, as we are in Tier 3, we must not mix households indoors.

If you have any of the recognised symptoms of Covid-19, book a test.

If you test positive, then self-isolate.

If you need further support, then phone:

- the We Are Bristol helpline on 0800 694 0184 (wider health and wellbeing issues)

Or the parent / carer:

- Is a Zambrano carer (derivative right to reside in the UK under European law as the primary carer of a British child or dependent adult)
